NATURE OF REVISION:

- 12 months extension in time (from 1st April, 2009 31st March, 2010)
- Additional of 1,853mt mixed commodities: 1,050 mt rice, 470 mt pulses, 219 mt vegetable oil, 67 mt CSB, 16 mt salt and 31 mt sugar.
- Additional associated costs.
- Allow time for preparation of successor development project.

JUSTIFICATION FOR THE REVISION:

During the past two years, the Government of RoC has made some commendable efforts to re-build the socio-economic infrastructure and increase the resources allocated to the social sector; however this positive trend is likely to be adversely affected by the decline of oil prices (the main source of income). Consequently, the Government has reduced its 2009 budget by 50% compared to last year.

In February 2008 a SDA carried out stated that more than 50% of the population in the Republic of Congo is living under the poverty line (equivalent to 544.40 FCFA/day or approximately US\$ 1). The most food insecure area remains the Pool region. The population remains dependant on imports that accounted for approximately 6% of the 2008 Government budget. The SDA report noted that global acute malnutrition is at 8%, underweight 14%, and stunting 30% among children below 5 years of age.

In November 2008, the PRRO evaluation mission noted that the number of children reached for the school feeding programme was only 39% of the planned mainly due to the late arrival of food and of the weaknesses in the implementation of the program by government. The mission had also found that the number of people living with HIV was underestimated and recommended expansion of this programme to reach more affected people.

This extension will allow the CO to improve the implementation of the activities as highlighted by the evaluation mission and preparation of the new programme for which the design requires an appraisal planned for the first half of 2009.

During the extension the CO will reach 112,500 beneficiaries through expanding school feeding activities to areas where UNICEF is implementing programmes for pygmies' children; scaling up support to PLHIV on PMTCT, ART, TB patients on DOTs & Orphans and Vulnerable children and focusing on food for work activities to contain the spread of Cassava mosaic virus.

The targeting criteria and food rations remain the same.

As anticipated in the design of the current PRRO document, general food distribution and supplementary feeding programmes will be scaled down.
