JUSTIFICATION FOR EXTENSION-IN-TIME

- 2. The shipment with food and Wiik halls, a loan from Haiti, took longer than planned to arrive in Cuba. The vessel arrived at the port of Santiago de Cuba on the night of 1 December 2012. Due to transportation constraints, it is likely that the food will only arrive at the final distribution point (FDP) in late December 2012 or early January 2013. This extension also allows some time for the distribution of food from the FDP to beneficiaries.
- 3. For the above reasons, we consider that the food distribution cannot be realistically completed by 30 December 2012. Consequently, an extension in time is requested.

Summary of existing project activities

- 4. Sandy is likely to be eastern Cuba's single most destructive hurricane in the past 50 years. The damage has been described by official sources as "substantial", hurting rural and major urban areas. Given the hurricane's impact on food availability in the country, the Government has accepted a WFP contribution for the most affected area. Through this IR-EMOP WFP is providing 793 mt of rice, beans and vegetable oil in order to complement the regular food ration that continues to be distributed by the government. Furthermore, 15 Wiik halls are being provided with the aim of guaranteeing the storage of food while government capacities in this sector recover.
- 5. After a short field visit to Santiago de Cuba province, the government has asked WFP for support with food for rehabilitation work brigades. Hence, WFP has reduced the rations of one beneficiary group to include this new beneficiary group.

Recommendation

6. Due to the reasons explained above the CO requests the extension in time at no additional cost to be approved by the Regional Director.
